Hebron Scrap Metal Recycling will accept personal computers, laptops, servers, routers, modems/switches, telephones, cell phones, printers, fax machines, copiers, speakers, stereos/VCRs/radios, remotes, keyboards, mice, all wire & cords, rechargeable batteries, docking stations, LCD screens (from computers), cable/satellite boxes, and DVRs.

Identity theft and fraud are a rational fear for individuals and businesses. By simply shredding old tax records, insurance records, bank statements, cancelled checks, health records, financial documents, legal documents, and all other sensitive documents you can help stop identity thieves in their tracks. We encourage community members to bring up to 5 boxes (approximately 100 pounds) of your unwanted paperwork to be destroyed safely and securely free of charge. Staples, rubber bands, folders and paper clips do not need to be removed before shredding. Allshred Services will be onsite to provide secure document destruction.
